**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

Ingleside is a tall compact Italianate Victorian frame house built on the banks of the Choptank River. It stands two stories upon a brick basement which has full size windows. To the west is a long two story addition which was installed in the early twentieth century. The main block is three bays long and two deep with a hip roof from which rise four bold chimneys, similar to Cherry Grove nearby. The walls are covered with weatherboard and there are corner pilasters. Around the hip roof is a bracketed cornice. A porch covers the entrance which has sidelights and architrave typical of the period. On the east side, in place of the two windows, are two bay windows with a window on each of the three facets. They are supported upon brick piers and have panels beneath the windows. On the south side is a screened porch on the first story.

The interior is very similar to Cherry Grove. It has a central stair hall with double parlors on the east and a single dining room on the west side. Formerly there were two rooms, but the partition has been removed. Prior to the installation of the wing, the kitchen was in the basement. Most of the interior trim is original, as well as the plaster cornice and medallions of the ceiling.

**STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE**

Ingleside is another of the great Ante-bellum houses constructed by the Hughlett family of which William Hughlett of Jamaica Point was the patriarch. It has a boldness and simplicity not found at either Cherry Grove or Belmont. The building stands as a reminder of the days when entertainment was an important part of the life of a country seat, and to the days when slaves and servants were part of the maintenance of this type of life style.


