DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Anchorage, Trappe, to differentiate it from the Anchorage on the Miles River, is situated on a knoll with its southwest facade looking over the Choptank River toward Cambridge in Dorchester. The house is a long one room deep dwelling similar in form to Ending of Controversy west of Easton, i.e. it is composed of three, two story telescoping sections. It is, however, different in its proportions for the large section is three bays long, the middle section two bays long and the smaller section is three bays long. All of the exterior has been covered with aluminum siding and many of the windows have been altered to include picture windows. A one story porch extends across most of both sides and part of each is enclosed, one for a bath and one for a porch. With the exception of the proportions, the exterior looks like a tract house.

Inside, the plan consists of a one time parlor and stair hall in the tallest part, dining room and corridor in the middle part and den and kitchen in the lowest part. There is also a leanto. The parlor, now a bedroom, retains its period mantel c. 1830 having pilasters and several courses of fine reeding drill holes etc, typical of late Federal work. The balustrade was replaced in the mid-19th century except for the enclosed stair to the attic, which is very narrow. Most of the remainder of the dwelling has been altered. From the attic it is evident that the two lower wings were originally one and one-half story sections, more like neighboring Bunker Hill Farm.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Architecturally the Anchorage, Trappe, is significant as a late Federal telescopic farmhouse comparable to Bunker Hill and Quest Over, Dorchester County. The best portions of the original fabric have been obliterated except for those mentioned above (# 7).




