DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Jones House is located at the end of a dirt lane approximately one half mile north of the Tilghman Island bridge. It is an eighteenth century house that was moved to this site from Virginia.

The house is one and one-half storys and three bays wide. It is constructed on a brick foundation and the gable ends are brick with partially protruding chimney stacks and small half story windows. The north and south facades are clapboard and have a central entrance with 9/9 sash windows in the other bays. There are three gabled dormers on each side of the roof. The north facade has a one story, one bay modern screened in porch. A two bay frame addition has been constructed on the west side. Much of the original woodwork was retained in the house.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This small house was moved to its present site from Virginia during the 1970's. Architecturally, it was a good vernacular house of its period, which appears to be about mid-18th century. It relates favorably with other vernacular houses in the area of the same period.

The moving of this building is an indication of the rising interest in old buildings, especially located on the water, and the impact which the preservation movement has had especially in the East.

A small wing on the building may be completely new. The design and execution are very tastefully accomplished given the locations.
