Tanyard, probably built by Charles Bowdle, consists of a two-story brick section, and two frame additions that form a telescope design. The brick section's symmetrical approach side is laid in Flemish bond and has the unusual feature of two six-panel front doors. The east wall has random glazed headers, but none of the walls has a water table or beltcourse. The central and west frame sections have undergone great remodeling, but an early photograph shows a 1½ story frame kitchen wing connected to the brick section by a 1½ story hyphen. At one time, tan was made from bark on this property.
