Simple commercial buildings of about 1900, the brick structures now occupied by Blades and Company have a flat facade of orange brick and a cast iron cornice with brackets and corner blocks. Pilasters and inset panels with molded brick detailing further enliven the facade. The buildings are a pleasant compliment to the Federal period structures on the block.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Numbers 18 and 16 North Washington Street are two brick late nineteenth century stores which are now connected and used as one. Each building is of two bays and two floors with a roof which slopes toward the rear. The buildings are identical. There is a modern addition on the rear of #14.

The facade is of warm orange brick laid in common bond with crisp white mortar lines. There is a flat marble belt course running flush with the brick face at the sill line of the second floor windows. At the corners of each building is a pilaster which is a shaft of brick set out from the face of the building; at the level of the second floor window lintel, they are decorated by a flat unmolded course of marble. The frieze of these buildings is a band of raised brick with inset panels of brick boarded with molded brick in the egg-and-tongue pattern. Above the brick frieze are ornamental bands of brick, one of which has an inscribed chain pattern. The cornice is cast iron with projecting corner blocks decorated with fleur de lis and arabesque. The cornice brackets are decorated in stylized floral patterns and on the panels between the five brackets are fan and floral designs. The cornice above the first floor store windows is also cast iron; its simple console - like brackets support the cove molding above.

Windows which are one over one have segmented arches of long, narrow Roman brick and sills which are indicated as the projecting portions of the belt course. A second horizontal line appears at the midpoint (stile) of the windows as a course of inset brick between the windows and links of the chain motif on the pilasters. These brick devices as well as the cornice emphasize the horizontal and unify the two buildings.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Although very simple, these buildings are examples of the type of commercial building constructed in Easton around 1900. They maintain the street wall across from the Talbot County Court House and are a pleasant compliment in both scale and decoration to the earlier Federal buildings on the block. Flat buildings with a bracketed cornice, their present store front is not incompatible for it too is flat and has a bracketed cornice at the second floor line. The original store front would probably have had large glass windows with cast iron detailing, similiar to that on # 25 South Washington Street (T-411).

The property was the middle of the three brick store/houses as described in 1801. Patrick McNeal occupied the premises in 1813. James McNeal sold his inheritance in 1865 to Charles Robinson and it was devised to his daughters, Emma Covington and Ella Bell Robinson. J. Harry Covington acquired both interests and sold the store to the Shannahan and Wrightson Co. in 1920. This company sold the interest in 1925 to Morris Simon and his wife. Mr. Simon turned his ownership over in 1927 to Harry Hollis and Elmer Blades, as tenants in common. Harry Hollis became the sole owner and the Trustees of his estate passed the title to James Carmine. A half-interest in the property is now owned by Jackson C. Sewell.




