DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Six South Street is a two story frame dwelling covered by a shallow gable roof. This is an L-shaped building with an L-shaped porch at the front. The main entrance has a segmental arch, transom light, and side lights.

Window openings with six over six sash occur regularly on the first and second floors. They have louvered shutters. The front window on the first floor is double with one over one sash.

The gables terminate in a cornice and return. The cornice is enriched with rows of small, closely spaced console-type brackets.

Constructed C1860, the only major change is the front porch which was probably enlarged.

SPECIFIC DATES C1860 BUILDER/ARCHITECT Jeremiah Morris 1864-66

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Number Six South Street is constructed in the common L plan of the mid nineteenth century. One of several in the town, it is closely resembled by its western neighbor, Four South Street, which was constructed about ten years later.

L71/F130 In 1864 Jeremiah Morris bought this parcel of land with the corn house for \$200.00 from Sarah S. H. Trippe. He built his house on the northeast corner of his property, but in 1866 he sold the land, his new house and corn house for \$3,000.00 to Arianna Leonard, his wife's mother. However, Jeremiah Morris, his wife and three sons continued to live in the house that he had built. About ten years later, Arianna Leonard built a similar house for her son, Clement R., on the northwest corner of this property, to the west of the Morris house. Sarah Leonard Morris, wife of Jeremiah, inherited part of the land that had been purchased from her husband by her mother. She also received the house she was living in (Six South Street) plus the carriage house and stable that was at the rear of the property. In 1907 she sold her share of this property to her son, Charles Edmund Morris. In 1956 at the death of his wife, Emma, the property was inherited by their children, Charles E. Morris, Jr. and Margaret Morris Sargent. It is presently owned by Mrs. Sargent, granddaughter of Jeremiah Morris.






