2. DESCRIPTION OF PHYSICAL APPEARANCE:

The church is as it was constructed in 1856 except for a new brick facade and display windows added in the late 1950's. The addition at the rear of the building was completed in 1930 and served for church functions until the St. Mark's Methodist church was completed in March, 1958. The building is in excellent shape for its age.

3. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE:

The church was in active use from 1856 to 1958. See the manual of the thirty-fifth session of the Wilmington conference of the Methodist Episcopal church held in Easton, Md., March 18, 1903 which contains the history of the Easton M. E. church.

and is presently in use as a TV/appliance store. The first floor is carpeted and part of the tin decorative ceiling has been removed. The second floor, which was the former church sanctuary, is presently used as a furniture show room. The large stained glass windows are in place but the twenty foot high walls are covered with brick plywood to a height of sixteen feet. The decorative tin ceiling is still in place and <sup>as are</sup> the original brass and porcelain lighting fixtures.

The renovations will convert the street floor to house the offices of a CPA firm, repairing the tin ceiling, and exposing the edge grain ash hardwood floors in the offices. The second floor being offered for rent to the Waterfowl Festival to be used as a display area for waterfowl art and artifacts. The historic charm of the room would be preserved.

The exterior of the building will not be altered except to remove signs attached and painted on the structure.

The attached maps indicate the location. The area outlined in red denotes the Easton Historic District. The area outlined in yellow is the boundaries shown on the 1885 map which shows the location of the M.E. church. The orange marking on the Easton Historic District located the M.E. church on this map.

Photographs of the exterior are attached.


A picture of the church in 1903 or earlier is shown on the last page of the 1903 Wilmington conference information. A picture of the church as it appeared in 1958 is contained in the St. Mark's Methodist church opening service information. Note the steeple had been removed and the front faced in stone (probably in 1930).

A brief history of the building and its origins is presented chronologically:

1. 1777-1787 the Methodist Episcopal church was established in Talbot County.
2. 1791 a small church was constructed on Railroad Avenue.
3. 1829-30 brick church on West Street was constructed.
4. 1856 present church building was constructed using bricks from the West Street building.
5. 1911 church front was faced with granite.
6. 1930 addition to rear of church.
7. 1958 present colonial store front added in keeping with the character of the downtown retail area. This is a significant feature of the revisions to buildings in the town of Easton, which is the Colonial Capital of the Eastern Shore. This change is evidence of the early and successful efforts in keeping the downtown area vital yet retaining a touch with the past.








FRONT ELEVATION - LOOKING WEST






SOUTH ELEVATION - CLOSE


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
FIRST FLOOR SIDE WINDOWS
