A chain-of-title for the Hiss house strongly indicates the two-story house was built around 1878 after William J. and Deborah A. Keithley sold a 20' by 120' lot to Eleanore Blades for \$80. Between 1878 and 1914, Eleanore Blades married John D. Barnold, and the Barnolds sold the improved lot in 1914 for \$350 to Lawrence S. Fairbank. The St. Michaels town map of 1877 documents the fact that the lot was not improved at that time. The simple Victorian features of the house agree with the estimated date of construction. The property changed hands a dozen times since 1914. Most recently, Donald and Catherine Hiss purchased the house in 1983.

Standing in a line of nineteenth-century dwellings that front St. Mary's Square, the Hiss house is a modest two-story, frame dwelling. The relatively plain exterior is trimmed with a few late nineteenth-century features including the chamfered post front porch and the decorative sawnwork across the eave.

The Hiss house is located at 406 St. Mary's Square in the center of St. Michaels, Talbot County, Maryland. The two-story, two-bay frame house faces east with the gable oriented on a north/south axis.

Built around 1870-1880, the two-story, two-bay frame house is supported by a minimal brick foundation and sheathed with wood shingles. The medium pitched roof is covered with asphalt shingles. Attached to the main block is a two-story dining room and kitchen wing.

The east (main) facade is a two-bay elevation with a partially glazed door in the right bay and a six-over-six sash to the left. Covering the first floor is a front porch supported by chamfered posts. The second floor is lighted by evenly spaced six-over-six sash windows, and the front eave is trimmed with decorative sawnwork.

Built against the south wall is a modern brick chimney erected in place of the interior end brick stove stack. Modern sash windows have been added to the first floor to each side of the brick chimney. The eaves are slightly extended.

The west side of the one-room plan main block is largely covered by the two-story two-room plan service wing. A seam in north and south sides of the wing suggests different periods of construction. A shed roof porch supported by turned porch posts and decorated with sawn brackets is attached to the east gable end. The south end of the porch is enclosed with flush boards for a pantry.

The interior of the house has been partially remodeled during the last few years. The stair rises against the north wall of the front room with a twentieth-century balustrade. A beaded board and batten door opens into the stair closet. A second stair was formerly located in the rear room for access from the kitchen. The stair was removed in lieu of a first floor bathroom.

The relatively plain house is trimmed with a few late nineteenth-century features including the chamfered post front porch and decorative sawnwork across the front eave. The Hiss house stands in a line of nineteenth-century dwellings that mark the west side of St. Mary's Square.

### HISTORY AND SUPPORT

A chain-of-title for the Hiss house strongly indicates the two-story house was built around 1878 after William J. and Deborah A. Keithley sold a 20' by 120' lot to Eleanore Blades for \$80. (53/33). Between 1878 and 1914, Eleanore Blades married John D. Barnold, and the Barnolds sold the improved lot in 1914 for \$350 to Lawrence S. Fairbank. The St. Michaels town map of 1877 helps also by indicating the structure had not been erected by that time. The simple Victorian features of the house agree with the estimated date of construction. The property has changed hands a dozen times since 1914. Donald and Catherine Hiss purchased the house in 1983. (577/770)
