

SHERWOOD, MARYLAND 21665

Sherwood is a small, compact village of approximately forty houses. It is situated in the Bay Hundred peninsular on Waterhold Cove off Harris Creek to the east, and on Poplar Island Narrows to the west. There are two churches, one store and post office, and a seafood packing house at Lowes Wharf on the Bay side.

At the turn of the century there was a vegetable canning house on Waterhole Cove.

The village was probably settled in this location because there were at one time many natural springs in the area. This may be the reason for the name of the cove.

A cross gable house set at 45° angle to the road. Built in the form of a cross with cross gable roof. Each of four sections of the house is a rectangle with a square in center. There is a bay-type enclosure in the front corner. The house is two stories with screened porch on lower level and entrance is in bay.

Upper bay has 3 windows 2/2 with slight arch at top. Small gothic window in gable over bay.


