The Boy Scout log cabin, which stands in the center of St. Mary's Square, was built around 1938 for the local boy scout troop. Erected of rounded log slabs, the rectangular club house has a granite chimney stack on the north side and original fittings around the doors and windows. One of the carpenters who assisted in its construction was Josiah Fairbank, and masons, George Todd and Albert Wales, are remembered as the craftsmen who erected the granite chimney stack.

The single story club house is an interesting example of the rustic building techniques developed during the early twentieth century. These buildings were designed to imitate the appearance of a horizontal log structure since the exterior consists of round-faced log slabs attached to a tradition framework. This type of construction is relatively unusual for the Eastern Shore.

The Boy Scout log cabin stands in the center of St. Mary's Square in St. Michaels, Talbot County, Maryland. The single-story log meeting house faces west with the main gable oriented on an east/west axis.

Built around 1938, the half-round log slab structure is supported by block piers, and it is covered by a medium pitched asphalt shingle roof.

The west (main) facade is a symmetrical three-bay elevation with a center double-door entrance and flanking six-pane windows. The vertical log slab door is hung on long strap hinges. A boarded over square window opening pierces the upper gable.

The north and south sides are sides are lighted by six-pane windows that have been boarded over. Rising on the north side is an exterior granite chimney stack.

The interior was not seen.

The stone masons were George Todd and Albert Wales.

Doug Hope recommended that I call his brother who lives near Chester, Virginia (804-458-4004) who helped with the construction. No answer.

The carpenter was a Josiah Fairbank. Should say "one-of-the".

Whatever design there was, was done locally.


I will try researching the newspaper for 1937-38 and see what I can come up with.
