The Star of Bellevue Masonic Lodge #86 is a prominent two-story frame building that stands in the center of the waterfront community of Bellevue. Reported to have been erected by Nicholas B. Gardner for entertainment purposes, the building was converted to a general store. The local chapter of masons now uses the building for formal meetings as well as social gatherings.

Reported by local residents to date to the late nineteenth century, the structure is believed to have been built for Nicholas B. Gardner for village entertainment. Later the building was known as the Gardner general store, one of several stores that operated in the village during the early twentieth century.

Prepare both a summary paragraph and a general description of the resource and its various elements as it exists today.

The Star of Bellevue Masonic Lodge #86 stands on the north side of Poplar Lane in the center of Bellevue, Talbot County, Maryland. The two-story, two-bay gable-front frame lodge building faces southeast with the gable roof oriented on a southeast/northwest axis.

Built around 1890, the two-story rectangular lodge building is supported by a low brick foundation, and it is sheathed with a layer of asphalt siding. The medium pitched roof is covered with tin.

The southeast (main) elevation is an asymmetrical facade with an off-center front entrance as well as a side entrance flanked by small replacement windows. The second floor, on the other hand, is marked by two evenly spaced single-pane sash windows. The eaves to the roof are slightly extended with short returns at the base.

The southwest side elevation is marked by a relatively even fenestration of single pane sash windows on each floor. An interior side brick stack pierces the roof line, while an exterior block chimney rises between the fifth and sixth bays. The northeast side is defined by an irregular placement of single-pane sash windows. The back side of the building is partially covered by a shed roof addition.

The interior has been moderately reworked to suit the needs of a lodge hall. The first floor is distinguished by beaded board walls. A stair, rising against the northeast wall, allows access to a large meeting room fitted with a stage in the north end. Narrow beaded board trims the stage which is flanked on each side by small enclosed rooms. Beaded board wainscoting trims the perimeter of the room.


