The Norman Gumby house is an unusual structure in the community of Bellevue. Unlike any other dwelling, this single story, three-bay rectangular house is topped by a low pitched segmental arched roof. Local resident, Otis Turner, relates that the building was moved from Deep Neck during the early twentieth century.

Although the original use of this house is unclear, structures such as these found on the lower Shore were used as accommodations for hunting parties along tidal creeks. Initially built on a shallow draft barge or flat boat, these early hunting lodges were sometimes pulled up on shore and placed on a foundation. Distinctive to these early hunting lodges was the low segmental arched roof.

The Norman Gumby house is located on the east side of Dawson Street in the center of Bellevue, Talbot County, Maryland. The single-story, three-bay frame dwelling faces southwest.

Built around 1900, this single-story house was formerly located on Deep Neck and moved to this site during the early twentieth century. The single-story frame structure is supported on a concrete block foundation, and the building is sheathed with asbestos shingles. The rectangular house is topped by a segmental arched roof.

The southwest (main) elevation is a three-bay facade with a center entrance and flanking six-over-six sash windows. The corners of the house are trimmed with simple pilasters. Sheltering the front door is a single-bay screened-in porch.

The north side of the house is marked by an exterior brick chimney with flanking six-over-six sash windows. The south side is defined by three six-over-six sash windows. Covering the back of the main block is a slightly shorter single-story wing.

The interior was not seen.


