The old Knights of Pythias lodge building in Bellevue is a vacant two-story frame structure similar in form to the Masonic lodge down the street. The Pythias building, however, has not been maintained. The front porch has collapsed. Nevertheless, the structure is an interesting contrast to the single and two-story frame dwellings that define Bellevue streets.

The building contributes to the architectural diversity of the village as well as the history of fraternal organizations as they developed around the turn of the twentieth century.

The Knights of Pythias Hall stands on the north side of Poplar Lane in the center of Bellevue, Talbot County, Maryland. The deteriorated two-story frame lodge building faces southeast with the gable roof oriented on a northwest/southeast axis.

Built around the turn of the twentieth century, the two-story, three-bay rectangular building is supported on a low brick pier foundation, and the building is sheathed with asphalt shingles.

The southeast (main) elevation is a three-bay facade with a center entrance and flanking six-over-six sash windows. Fixed in the center entrance is a partially glazed front door, under the collapsed front porch. The second floor is blind wall, and the eaves to the roof are slightly extended.

The northeast side elevation is an asymmetrical facade four-bay facade with an off-center side entrance and flanking six-over-six sash windows. The second floor is marked by three evenly spaced six-over-six sash windows.

The southwest side is marked by an interior side brick stack as well as a combination of six-over-six and two-over-two sash windows.

The interior was not seen.


