**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

Just above Skipton Landing is a small frame dwelling which was built in the first quarter of the 19th century. It is composed of a one and one-half story single room house with chimney plus a leanto on its west gable. When the house was remodeled in the sixties, another leanto was added across the rear of the dwelling containing kitchen, bath and bedroom.

Its south facade has a center door between two windows with 6/6 sash and a dormer with shed roof in the 'A' roof. On the west leanto facade is a door and single window with 4/4 sash. The original chimney rises from the roof of the addition.

Inside there are two original rooms, one higher than the other, plus an attic room in the larger part. Most of the interior was renewed in the sixties, but there are some original exposed joists in the ceiling.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Skipton Landing stands as a reminder of the type house in which lived the majority of the inhabitants of Maryland throughout the 17th and 18th centuries. Although this is early 19th century in date, it nevertheless is typical of the preceeding period as well as its own period. In this type structure lived farmers, hired help and slaves.


