DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Forrest Landing stands at the headwaters of Pickering Creek, a branch of the Wye River. The house is a twentieth century mansion composed of five parts in the tradition of the great mid-Georgian mansions of Maryland. It is not, however, a copy of any existing dwelling.

The body of the house is five bays long, two and one-half stories laid in Flemish bond. The central bay of the approach facade contains the door with sidelights with balcony and large arched window above (at landing level). Each of the eight windows of the facade have segmental arches with three stone members set within the arch. There are five dormers across the broad "A" roof with double chimneys rising at the gables. Across the creek side is a two story screened porch with gallery above to which the third floor has access.

Balancing one and one-half story hyphens and wings extend from each gable, the wings being set perpendicular to the main house. A chimney rises from the southeast gable of each wing. On the northeast side of the northeast wing is a two story frame shed which overlooks the service yard.

Opposite the service yard is a formal garden and on the southeast is a broad yard with bell-shaped drive to the outer wall. The northwest facade overlooks an undulating unformal lawn extending to the creek and an uninterrupted view up the creek.

The interior of the dwelling possesses some woodwork taken from the Tobias Rudolph House which originally was constructed in Elkton c. 1760. The woodwork is of the quality of other houses of the period in Elkton, i.e., Mitchell House, Partridge Hill, Gilpin Manor.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

From an historical standpoint, the eighteenth century Cecil County woodwork is the single most important part of Forrest Landing. It is, however, an extraordinary dwelling of the late Colonial Revival style, a style popular in Talbot County for an extended period of time. In composition it is similar to other houses of the period including Langshaws, Emerson Point, Webley, and Langdon.
