The Bud Larrimore house is located on the west side of Barneck Road in the village of Barneck on Tilghman Island, Talbot County, Maryland. The Larrimore house faces south with the principal gable oriented on an east/west axis.

Built between 1890-1900, the Larrimore house has both a roof and exterior cladding of asphalt shingles, although the original weatherboard exterior exists underneath this asphalt siding. The house is a side hall, single pile plan which has been expanded. The house is mounted on a brick pier foundation.

The three bay south (main) facade of the Larrimore house has a pair of two-over-two sash windows with wide surrounds and peaked crown mouldings. An entrance door serves as the eastern bay. The second floor is lit by three two-over-two sash windows with wide surrounds and peaked crown mouldings. The open eave has exposed rafter feet.

The east elevation has a two-story, two bay addition on the northern end which gives the house an L footprint. There is a one-over-one sash window on the first and second floors of this addition. The east gable end of the primary wing has no windows and the open eave is supported by decorative brackets.

The northern elevation has a pair of two-over-two sash windows on the second floor, and a modern shed addition sheathed in asbestos shingles across the first floor.

The western gable end has a central brick chimney and no windows. A one-story, modern shed addition is attached to the northern end of this western elevation.

The interior was not seen.


