Prepare both a summary paragraph and a general description of the resource and its various elements as it exists today.

The Barneck School is located on Barneck Road in the village of Barneck on Tilghman Island, Talbot County, Maryland. This one-and-a-half story frame structure faces north with the principal gable oriented on an east/west axis.

Built between 1890-1900, this former school building is a five bay structure clad in stucco and supported by a masonry foundation covered in cement. The roof is covered with asphalt shingles and the base of the building is covered by a wide wood trim.

The north (main) facade has a central door flanked by two-over-two sash windows with wide, plain wood surrounds. The first floor has a full width screen porch with turned posts which is not original to the school. The second floor has two gable roof dormers clad in asbestos shingles with two-over-two sash windows.

The two bay east elevation has a one-story single bay addition. One six-over-six sash window remains as the northern bay of the first floor and a pair of two-over-two sash windows are inset into the half story above. A brick chimney covered in cement is located at this east gable end.

The south elevation has three six-over-six sash windows and a one-over-one sash window on the first floor. The two gable roof dormers in the upper half story have two-over-two sash windows.

The west elevation has two six-over-six sash windows on the first floor and a pair of two-over-two sash windows on the upper half story. A brick chimney covered in cement is located at this west gable end.

The interior was not seen.



The Barneck School, originally a one room schoolhouse, served 14 pupils in 1913. In 1918 a school was built in the village of Tilghman to serve the entire population of the Island. The Barneck School ceased to be used at that time and was soon converted into a residence.

Although the school has been changed considerably, it remains a community landmark. The Barneck School is one of the few remaining vestiges of Barneck's once self-sufficient village life.
