Prepare both a summary paragraph and a general description of the resource and its various elements as it exists today.

The Andrew Birmingham House is located on the southeast corner of Route 33 and Coopertown Road in the village of Tilghman on Tilghman Island, Talbot County, MD. This flat roof house faces west.

Built in 1904, this two-story, frame house is covered in aluminum siding and supported by a brick pier foundation. The roof is covered with asphalt shingles.

The west (main) facade has a central door flanked by two-over-two sash windows on either side with wide green surrounds. The door is sheltered by a gable roof portico supported by plain posts. The second floor is lit by two two-over-two sash windows.

The north elevation has one two-over-two sash window and one small six-over-six sash window on the first floor. There are two two-over-two sash windows on the second floor. Two interior chimneys are located on this north side.

The east elevation has one two-over-two sash window on the first and second floors.

The south elevation has two two-over-two sash windows and two entrance doors on the first floor. A screened porch supported by doric columns stretches across most of the first floor. This porch and the entrance portico are later additions. The second floor has three two-over-two sash windows and one small one-over-one sash window.

The interior was not seen.



Andrew Birmingham helped to build this house for his family in 1904. It remained in the Birmingham family until 1987. The deep, narrow plan of this house is unusual for the village of Tilghman. The classical detail of the south elevation is also unusual. The house is set close to the street and extends to the east of the lot. It is a contributing example of turn of the twentieth century architecture on Tilghman Island.
