DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Like the Zion Church across the street, 210-212 North Potomac Street appears to be made up of elements from different stylistic periods [suspect that facade here may be applied to earlier building]. A 2 storey double house, the front facade of 210-212 is divided into three large vertical bays, each containing a pair of windows on the second floor and the same on the ground floor, except for the center bay which has two entrance doors beneath a bracketed porch. These bays are set apart by wood pilasters which run the full height of the 2 storeys and connect with the cornice; there are four pilasters in all. Another interesting feature is the rusticated wood siding -- designed to simulate stone.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE (Include Personages, Dates, Events, Etc.)

Part of a continuous row of mid 19th century dwellings, 210-212 North Potomac Street was probably built about the same time or a little earlier than its mansard roof neighbors. Interestingly, the facade of the house is covered with wood rustication and full-height pilasters [in the manner of a Middle Georgian house] which appear to be about 1870 [?]. This must be an early, or rare example of a Victorian house being so consciously Georgianized.
