

ABSTRACT

41 South Potomac Street

Sandwiched between two twentieth century buildings, the Victorian decorative detailing of the upper levels of the facade (east side) of this nineteenth century brick structure contributes greatly to the visual impact of the streetscape through harmonious contrast with the neighboring structures. The facade is particularly interesting for the bay window on the second story and the bracketed cornice.

The brickwork on the facade indicates that the building probably was erected in two stages: the first two stories being built in the early nineteenth century and the third level added in the late 1800s. The lower stories of the facade have Flemish brick bonding while the bricks of the top floor are laid in Common bond.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The building stands at 41 South Potomac Street in Hagerstown, Washington County, and is located on the west side of the street near the center of the block formed by Public Square and Antietam Street.

The building is presently a three stories high, painted brick structure which sits tight to the sidewalk and neighboring buildings. It has a rectangular facade (east side) with a mid-twentieth century decorative detailing on the second and third floors. The brickwork on the facade, however, indicates that the third story was added sometime well after the lower portion was erected. This alteration was probably made in the late 1800s when many such changes were made to other buildings in this section of Hagerstown. The present appearance of the upper stories is probably the result of these renovations.

The second floor of the facade has Flemish bond brickwork, a tripartite bay window with four windows, brackets, and a roof balustrade, and a segmental arch window to the south of the bay window. The top or third level of the facade has three symmetrically arranged, segmental arch windows. The bricks of this story are laid in Common bond. The single windows of the upper stories have rectangular, double-hung, wooden sashes with one-over-one lights. The arch panels of the windows have incised decoration. The facade is terminated with a bracketed cornice.






