

## ABSTRACT

111-113 West Washington Street

Mid-Late Nineteenth Century

Hagerstown

Washington County

This nineteenth century brick house appears to date from the second half of the century. It has the side-hall-with-double-parlors configuration of the earlier classical styles but has circa 1860s-1870s decorative detailing. The structure has a three bay wide facade (north side) with segmental arch openings and a modillioned cornice with dentils. The east and west side walls have internal double-end chimneys and parapets. The building, which abuts the sidewalk and the house to the west, is painted except for the facade which was cleaned recently.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (If known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE	
<p>The building stands at 111-113 West Washington Street in Hagerstown, Washington County, and is located on the south side of the street in the eastern fourth of the block formed by Summit Avenue and Prospect Street.</p> <p>The building is a mid to late nineteenth century brick house which is two and a half stories high with a gable roof and rests on a cut stone foundation. It has a three-bay facade (north side) with a modillioned cornice, two sets of internal double-end chimneys, and side wall parapets. The structure, which is painted on all of the exposed sides except the facade, sits tight to the sidewalk and the neighboring building to the west. A narrow walkway runs along the east wall.</p> <p>The facade (north side) has segmental arch windows and a segmental arch doorway, which is missing the outer set of double doors but still has a transom. The entranceway is located in the westerly end bay and has panelled framing. The windows have double-hung, wooden sashes with two-over-two or two-over-one lights. The bricks on the facade are laid in Stretcher bond and cleaned (possibly sandblasted) of paint in recent years.</p> <p>The interior has the side hall, double parlor room arrangement and heavy, 1870s type of woodwork.</p>

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This nineteenth century brick house appears to date from the second half of the century. It has the side-hall-with-double-parlors configuration of the earlier classical styles but has circa 1860s-1870s decorative detailing. The structure has a three bay wide facade (north side) with segmental arch openings and a modillioned cornice with dentils. The east and west side walls have internal double-end chimneys and parapets. The building, which abuts the sidewalk and the house to the west, is painted except for the facade which was cleaned recently.

The building is an example of the strong influence that the classical styles of the eighteenth and early nineteenth centuries had on architecture of the late 1800s. As noted above, the configuration of this building is one of an earlier period and closely resembles the forms of several 1820s and 1830s houses along West Washington Street (see numbers 131-135, 137-139, and 148-152 for specific examples). The cornice which also is classical is expressed in a Victorian manner with terminating late nineteenth century brackets.


