
Property Name/Address: 128-130 East Franklin St., Hagerstown, Maryland

Description/Significance: A ca. 1890 brick town house with a mansard roof, reflecting the influence of the Colonial Revival style. It is a double house, six bays wide, with entrances located in the two central bays. The transomed entrances are set in segmental-arched surrounds, and are surmounted by unusual peaked hoods supported on large consoles. On the second story, the central bays hold wide round-arched windows in openings detailed with stone impostes and keystones. The outlying bays on both stories hold 1/1 windows; the openings have decorative stone keystones and sills, and the windows are fitted with operable louvered shutters. Above a bracketed cornice, the mansard is faced with patterned slate; there is a central dormer of brick with two round arched windows, which is flanked on either side by a pedimented dormer with a single 1/1 sash. The building retains a very high level of integrity.
