Property Name/Address: 200 South Potomac St., Hagerstown, Maryland


Description/Significance: A stuccoed stone house located at the southeast corner of South Potomac and Baltimore streets. Although it has been extensively altered, the building's original five-bay-wide, two-room-deep configuration remains discernible; it is an early structure in a prominent location, and may have functioned as a tavern or hotel in the late 18th or early 19th century. In 1910 the building was a feed and grain store, with wagon scales located in Baltimore Street.¹
