Property Name/Address: 277 South Potomac St., Hagerstown, Maryland

Description/Significance: A late 18th century frame or log house with a Flemish bond brick exterior chimney. The two-story building appears to have been constructed in at least two stages; its present configuration is four bays wide by one room deep, with a lower ell to the rear. The exterior is finished in modern materials, but the early form appears to remain largely intact.<sup>1</sup>


