Description

This is a two-and-a-half story, three bay frame house with a gable roof covered with corrugated steel. There is a shed roofed porch across the front with the original columns and balustrade. There is also an enclosed porch on the rear of the house. The house has been covered with asbestos siding and is sitting on a concrete block foundation. This house is typical of modest frame structures built during Hancock's construction boom in the early 20th century.
