Description

This is a two story, three bay frame or log house with a gable roof covered with sheet metal. Across the front is a raised porch with an original balustrade and posts. The house has been covered with asbestos siding and is sitting on a rubble stone foundation. The house appears on the Sanborn map and may be on the 1877 Atlas map. It is typical of late 19th century domestic architecture along the National Pike in Western Maryland.


