Description

This is a two story stuccoed frame or log house with some Federal style influences. The gable roof is covered with standing seam metal. It is a three bay structure with two over two and six over one window pane units. Across the front is an early 20th century porch. According to town historians it was the home of Dr. Tabler who came to Hancock in 1905. The lot immediately to the east, now occupied by a two story brick building, was once Dr. Tabler's Victorian garden.
