Description

This is a two story, three bay frame or log house with a standing seam metal roof. It has a large brick chimney inside the west end wall. Across the front is a late 19th century porch with original balustrade, posts and brackets. The exterior is covered with wood German siding and the house sits on a stone foundation. It does appear on the 1908 Sanborn map. This house is representative of Hancock's earlier appearance, before the era of growth and development in the early 20th century.


