Description

This is a two story, three bay brick house with a metal standing seam roof. It has six over six windows. Across the front is a turn-of-the-century porch with a second floor deck with balustrade. Known as the "Grove House," this was the birthplace of Lt. Gen. Richard K. Sutherland whose father was U.S. Senator from West Virginia.


