Description

This is a two story brick Colonial Revival Foursquare house with a hip roof and dormers that are covered with asphalt shingles. It is a three bay structure with eight over one and six over one window pane units. There is a wrap-around front porch with original balustrade and columns. Built by Taliaferrow Bridges, a local builder and developer of the early 20th century, it reflects Hancock's building boom of that time. It is known as the Milton Taylor house.
