Description

This is a two story brick house with an added central cross gable. It is a four bay structure with one over one windows. Across the east elevation is a porch, the exterior is painted brick and was being covered with vinyl siding when photographed. The house sits on a rubble stone foundation. This building is historically known as the Ogle House. As a 19th century structure it represents Hancock's earlier history, although the house has been substantially altered recently.
