Description

This is a two story Georgian Revival style house. It has a gambrel style roof with three dormers on the front side of the house and the roofing material is simulated slate (asphalt shingles to look like slate). It is a seven bay structure with sixteen over one window pane units. Across the front is a porch with original columns, there is a also a glassed-in porch on the south side of the house and a small addition added to the rear of the house. The exterior is yellow brick and the house sits on a poured concrete foundation. It is one of several early 20th century mansions near Grand and Baptist Roads.
