Description

"Raymondhurst" is a two story brick Colonial Revival house. The gable roof and three dormers on the front side of the house are covered with asphalt shingles. It is a five bay house with six over one and one over one windows and a central Palladian window. There is a wrap-around porch on the front, west and east sides of the house. It was built about 1910 for Mr. Henderson who owned the Round Top Cement Company and other business interests, by local builder, Albert Carr.
