Description

This is a two story Colonial Revival brick Foursquare house with a hip roof and hip dormers that are covered with slate. It is a four bay structure with nine over one window pane units with stone headers and sills. Across the front is a wrap-around porch with original balustrade and paired columns. There is also a garage on the property. The house was built by local contractor Albert Carr for the Exline family and reflects the early 20th century building patterns in Hancock.
