Description

This is a two story frame house with a gable roof covered with asphalt shingles. It is a three bay structure with two over two windows. Across the front is a porch with the original cutwork balustrade, post and turned brackets. The exterior is covered with aluminum siding and the house is sitting on a rubble stone foundation. The house appears on the 1908 Sanborn map, and like it's neighbors in this block, reflects residential construction patterns in Hancock in the late 19th century.
