Description

This is a two story L-shaped frame house with a front projecting gable. The roof is covered with sheet metal. It is a two bay structure with one over one windows. There is a bay window on the first floor, front side, and a Palladian window in the gable. Across the front is a porch which has been altered. The exterior is covered with asbestos siding. It sits on a rubble stone foundation and appears on the 1908 Sanborn map. The house is typical of residential construction patterns in Hancock at the turn-of-the-century.
