Description

This is a two story L-shaped frame house with Queen Anne influences and a front projecting gable. The roof is covered with asphalt shingles. It is a three bay structure with one over one windows. There are pointed and molded details on the window hoods. Across the front is a wrap-around porch with original balustrades and turned posts. The exterior is covered with asbestos siding and the foundation is rubble stone. The house appears on the 1908 Sanborn map, and represents Hancock's major development phase of the early 20th century. Also significant is the quantity of remaining original character defining features.
