Description

This is a two story brick house with some Queen Anne influences. It has a hip roof with cross gables covered with painted slate. It is a four bay structure with one over one or diamond panes over one windows. Across the front is a wrap-around porch with the original balustrades and columns. It has a brick foundation, and the gables are covered with aluminum siding. This house appears on the 1908 Sanborn map, and was built for Hancock businessman and developer John T. Mason by Albert Carr, local contractor.

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
