Description

This is a two story frame house with a gable-front. The roof is covered with asphalt shingles. It is a two bay structure with three over one windows. Across the front is a wrap-around porch with the original balustrades, turned posts and gingerbread. The exterior has been covered with insul siding. The foundation is rubble stone and there is a garage on the property. This house appears on the 1908 Sanborn map, and reflects turn-of-the-century construction during Hancock's major growth phase.
