DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE	
<p>This house is located on the south side of State Route 144, Old U. S. Route 40, about three miles west of the center of Hagerstown in Washington County, Maryland. It is situated on level ground along the road and faces north.</p> <p>The dwelling consists of two structures adjoined at their broad elevations and covered with buff stucco. The front or main section is two stories high and three bays in length. It is of frame construction. A large gabled dormer extends from the north elevation of the main roof span, set toward the west end of the house. Portions of the rear section are said to be of log construction.</p> <p>Windows show irregular placement. Single pane, double hung sashes are held within narrow frames trimmed with wide facing and topped with pedimented architraves. A semicircular window with similar trim lights the dormer. A three sided projecting bowed window is located near the east end of the north elevation. Its central upper sash includes an arrangement of decorative rectangular panes. Windows at the rear section are similar in appearance. Most windows are flanked with pairs of paneled shutters at the first story and covered shutters at the second floor level.</p> <p>The main entrance is located in the center bay of the front elevation. It is framed and trimmed similarly to the windows and includes a narrow transom. A two bay entrance porch, supported by elaborately turned posts, extends from the front door to the west end of the house.</p> <p>The roofs of both sections extend beyond the end walls and are covered with sheet metal. Small brick chimneys with corbeling at their tops are located inside gable ends.</p> <p>The house is in good to excellent condition and is situated on a tract containing 18.5 acres.</p>

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The area of significance of this house is its architecture. Constructed in sections, it represents several periods of building. The main portion of the house appears to date from the <sup>late</sup> nineteenth century, as does the earlier rear section. It achieves significance as an example of Washington County's vernacular architecture.

The house stands on part of "Addition to Hager's Delight". The property was in the Schindel family from 1833 to 1888. (RR/454, I. N. 10/468, 91/518).




