DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This structure is located on the north side of U.S. Route 40, about 1/4 mile east of the intersection of Maryland Route 63 and Route 40. It is situated by the side of a small stream and faces south or toward the highway.

The house is a two-story, three-bay brick dwelling painted yellow with brown trim. Extending to the rear of the brick section and perpendicular to it is a 1-1/2 story, four-bay log el covered with wooden siding.

The brick portion of the house rests on high rubble fieldstone foundations. Its facade wall is laid in flemish bond. Other walls display common bond brick work. Windows contain two-over-two pane Victorian style sashes set within simply frames in the brick section. In the log section windows are framed with architrave molding. Windows at the south and west elevations are flanked by louvered shutters. Small four-light openings are located at the attic level at the east and west gables of the building.

The main entrance is located in the west bay of the facade. It is framed very simply with a transom over the door. Other doors are located at the two center bays of the west and east sides of the log section. All are very plain.

A one-story, three-bay Victorian period entrance porch extends along the facade. Another entrance porch protects the doors on the west side of the log section. A low porch which is part of the main roof span extends over the south wall of the el. It is supported by square posts posts set above high stone foundations.

A brick chimney is located inside the east gable end of the brick section. An exterior brick flue rises along the north gable of the log section.

The roof of the brick section and the front porch is of shingle, extending for several inches beyond the house wall at the gables. The roof of the log el is covered with sheet metal. The roof line is broken by two pairs of gable dormers set in its east and west elevations.

The property on which this house stands contains 9.20 acres. The structure is in fair condition and is not at this time in danger of destruction.


