DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE	
<p>White Hall is located on the west side of White Hall Road just north of its junction with Mt. Aetna Road in Washington County. It is situated on a rise of ground above White Hall Road and faces east.</p> <p>The structure is a two-story, seven-bay stone dwelling covered with white stucco. A small, concrete block lean-to is attached to the rear of the house.</p> <p>The south four bays are recessed under a double porch which is included under the main roof span. This porch is supported by turned posts and is partially enclosed by a plain balustrade.</p> <p>Windows appear to have been spaced in the front elevation with some concern for symmetry. They have narrow framing and hold two-over-two pane Victorian period sashes, the upper panes having arched tops. Windows at the front elevation are flanked with louvered shutters.</p> <p>The main entrance is located in the third bay from the north end of the house. The arched entranceway is flanked by pilasters and is lined with paneled jambs which match the six-panel door. Above the door is a semi-circular fan with ray muntins. Secondary entrances are located in the two inner bays under the recessed porch. These are simple rectangular openings which include transoms. One entrance is present at the upper level of the porch and at the rear of the house.</p> <p>The roof is covered with slate and extends beyond the end walls of the house. The eaves boxing is finished with courses of simple molding. A large brick chimney rises from inside the north gable end. Two smaller chimneys are located inside the south gable end and extending from the center of the house.</p> <p>Immediately behind the house is a small summer kitchen or service building. It is covered with siding and has a large stone and brick exterior chimney. Also present is a stone smokehouse. South of the dwelling is a large stone end bank barn.</p> <p>The house is in good condition and stands on a tract containing 154 acres.</p>

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE			
<p>The area of significance of White Hall is its architecture. No recorded date has been found indicating the year that this house was built. However, a local resident has reported that an 18th century date can be seen in the attic. White Hall has the appearance of a mid-19th century dwelling, particularly as evidenced by the double porch along the front elevation. The window sashes are reminiscent of the Victorian period. If portions of the house date from before the mid-19th century they have been substantially altered. However, the arched doorway and small sized windows of the northern section of the front elevation could suggest an early building date.</p> <p>John Hanna purchased the property on which White Hall is located sometime in the late 19th century. In his will, dated June 3, 1837, Hanna bequeaths his land to his sons. Isaac was to receive the portion later named White Hall, which John Hanna described as including the improvements which he occupied. In 1846, the property passed from the Hanna to the Huyett family, in whose possession it remained until 1876.</p>


