DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Snavely Farm is located on the west side of a private lane about 1/2 mile south of Keiffer-Funk Road in the Chewsville vicinity of Washington County, Maryland. It is situated on an area of level ground and faces east.

The structure is a two-story, four-bay stone dwelling with a one-story, two-bay extension attached to its south gable end. The exterior woodwork is painted dark green.

The walls are constructed of roughly coursed local fieldstone which shows evidence of modern repointing. There is no decorative masonry associated with the exterior of the building.

Windows appear to have been spaced evenly in the front elevation. They show narrow framing except for wide wooden sills. Some first story windows are flanked by three-panel shutters.

The main entrance is located in the second bay from the north end of the front elevation. The doorway is simple in appearance with framing similar to the windows. A narrow transom is present over the door. A similar door is located in the east elevation of the one-story section.

A one-story entrance porch with a low hipped roof extends along the front elevation of the main section. Another porch is included under the main roof span of the one-story section.

The roof is covered with sheet metal and is finished at the gables with a plain barge board. The eaves are finished with unadorned boxing. Brick chimneys are located inside each gable end of the main section and inside the south end of the one-story structure.

The house is in good condition and is located on a tract containing 54.25 acres. Southwest of the house is a barn and other outbuildings related to agricultural use.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The area of significance of this house is its architecture. Constructed of stone in the four-bay, off-center front door plan, it is representative of a major architectural group in Washington County. Houses with this door and window arrangement seem to be prevalent in areas where there was a high concentration of German settlers.

This property has included 54.25 acres since it was purchased by Jacob Warvel from Henry Rinehart in 1844. It remained in the Warvel family until 1929.





