DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This house is located at 425 Harp Road, about 1/2 mile south of Maryland Route 64 in the Hagerstown vicinity of Washington County, Maryland. It is situated on level ground and faces south.

The structure is a one-and-a-half story, four-bay stone dwelling with white trim. A three-bay, one-story stone addition extends to the rear.

The walls are constructed of roughly coursed local fieldstone. In the el, rubble stones are used. Evidence of repointing is evident at all walls. There is no decorative stonework associated with the exterior of the building.

The windows are spaced evenly in the front and side elevations. Those which retain early frames have wide wooden members secured with pegs. The frames are finished with quarter round trim and with a bead at the inside edge. Nine-over-six pane double-hung sashes are held within the frames. At the side walls, modern single-pane sashes have been installed. At the el, wide wooden frames with pegged joining hold six-over-six light sashes.

The main entrance is located in the second bay from the east end of the front elevation. It is very simple in appearance and is framed similarly to the windows. A narrow four-light transom is present over the door.

A wide overhanging porch framed under the main roof span extends along the front and rear elevations. It is supported at the front elevation by turned square posts.

The roof of the main section is covered with asphalt shingles. At the el, corrugated sheet is the roofing material. The roof extends for some distance beyond the end walls with small brick chimneys rising from inside each gable end. A very large stone chimney is located inside the north gable of the el.

The house is in excellent condition and stands on a tract containing 4.09 acres.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The area of significance of this house is its architecture. Constructed of stone in the four-bay, off-center floor plan, this structure is an example of Washington County's early vernacular architecture, probably reflecting German building traditions. Although the building is not dated, the use of wide wooden window frames with pegged joining would suggest a building date before about 1840. The house may have been built by the Bovey family who settled on the property in 1818.




