DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE	
<p>This house is located east of White Hall Road, about one mile south of Chewsville in Washington County. It is situated on an area of level ground and faces southeast. It is now approached from the west by a dirt lane. Thus, the main entrances are now in the northwest elevation.</p> <p>The structure is a two-story, four-bay brick dwelling with white trim. Some modern work in the southeast elevation is of concrete block construction.</p> <p>The walls are set on low fieldstone foundations and are constructed in common bond at all elevations. There is evidence of considerable alteration to the southeast wall of the structure. A vertical seam extending the height of the wall is located the distance of one and a half bricks from the south corner of the structure. The central section of the front elevation consists of a concrete block addition. Evidence of a window is present in the second bay from the east corner of the house.</p> <p>Windows consist of six-over-six pane double-hung sashes held within narrow frames trimmed with a bead. Broad wooden lintels are present over each opening. Some first story windows have paneled shutters while several of the upper story openings are flanked with louvered shutters.</p> <p>Two original entrances are located in the first and third bays from the west corner of the northwest elevation. They are framed similarly to the windows and have high transoms over the doors.</p> <p>The roof of corrugated sheet metal terminates with a plain barge set directly against the end walls. The eaves boxing is finished with simple cornice molding. Brick chimneys with corbels at their tops are located inside each gable end. A smaller flue of brick extends from the interior of the house near the southwest wall.</p> <p>The alterations to the southeast elevation of this house suggest that it originally had a recessed double porch two or three bays in length. The east section of the southeast elevation appears to be in its original location while the remainder of the wall seems to be a series of additions enclosing the porch.</p> <p>A small barn and other outbuildings are located southwest of the dwelling.</p> <p>The house is in fair condition and is located on a tract containing 88.87 acres.</p>

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The area of significance of this house is its architecture. Constructed of brick with, presumably, a recessed double porch along part of its front elevation, it is representative of a major mid 19th century architectural group in Washington County. Many such structures are to be seen in the county. Most are constructed of brick and date from between 1845 and 1865. The use of common bonding at all elevations as well as the type of woodwork associated with the windows and doors also suggests a mid 19th century building date.
