DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This house is located on the north side of Jugtown Road, just west of Mt. Lena Road in Washington County, Md. It is situated on level high ground at the base of South Mountain and faces south.

The structure is a two-story, three-bay stone dwelling covered with a coating of rough cast or stucco. A one-and-a-half story, two-bay log section extends to the rear.

The actual wall construction of the front section of the house could not be observed because of the stucco. However, the logs of a portion of the rear section were exposed, although coated with several layers of whitewash. The corner joining is primitive showing roughly squared ends rather than "V" notching.

Windows of both sections display narrow framing with hose at the first story of the front section having six-over-six pane double-hung sashes. Upper story windows have three-over-three light windows.

The main entrance is in the center bay of the front elevation. It is simple in appearance and is finished with a small shed roofed entrance porch. A one-story shed roof porch extends along the west elevation of the log section. It is supported by square posts.

The roof of sheet metal extends beyond the end walls of the main section. The ends of the rafters which have been tapered, are exposed at the eaves. A small flue is located at the interior of the front section. A large stone exterior chimney with a modern concrete block extension is located at the north gable end of the log section.

The house is in good condition and is located on a tract containing 24 acres.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The area of significance of this house is its architecture. Constructed in sections and partially of log, it reflects Washington County's vernacular building patterns.

Log structures were built in Washington County from the earliest days of settlement through much of the 19th century. Many are in use today disguised by various forms of siding or bricks. The log section of this house is one of the few structures in the County where the wall construction can be observed. Several log dwellings are located in the Jugtown area. Most appear to date from the late 19th century. A structure is not depicted on this location on an 1859 map of Washington County.

Jugtown is said to have been named for a number of prohibition era whiskey making operations in the vicinity.


