This 18th century road which appears to have run along the Antietam Creek between Hagerstown and Leitersburg in Washington County, Maryland presumably provided access to the numerous mills and farms which were established along the Antietam Creek at an early date. It also passed by the Antietam Church, one of the oldest in Washington County.

Described as a wagon road in 18th century deeds, it seems to have been improved to the extent that it was designated as being able to accommodate vehicular traffic.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Running along the east bank of the Antietam Creek from Hagerstown toward Leitersburg in Washington County, Maryland, are the remnants of an 18th century wagon road.

Although the trail or pathway does not appear on the available 18th or 19th century maps of the County, its existence is evidenced by deeply worn ruts in the earth. Some segments of the road are still in use as driveways or farm lanes while other sections have been completely obliterated by cultivation. In wooded areas the course of the road is recognizable by the affect it has had on the pattern of vegetation.

Described as a wagon road in the deed for the 18th century Antietam Church property, it led past the church site, it appears to have crossed the Antietam at Trovinger Mill (WA-I-071), turned northward and recrossed the creek approximately one half mile upstream. It then continued in a northeasterly direction. Its junction with present day Old Forge Road can still be seen just east of Herman Myers Road. At this point it may have forked with one segment extending directly east to the Antietam Forge and Mill Site (WA-I-054). Traces of the road are again observable southwest and northeast of Clopper Road, west of the creek. It is not known whether this thorofare extended beyond Leitersburg and Hagerstown or whether it merged with other roads. It would appear to have linked the extensive settlement actively along the Antietam Creek during the 18th century.


