DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE		
<p>This house is located on the east side of Antietam Drive in the village of Security east of Hagerstown, Maryland. It is situated over a spring and is constructed into a steep bank between the road and the Antietam Creek. It faces north.</p> <p>The structure is a two and a half story stone dwelling constructed of roughly coursed local limestone. Its west gable end is one story in height, while its east gable wall plunges three stories to the base of the steep bank, covering the outlet of a spring a few feet from the bank of the creek. The north, or front elevation of the structure, has been coated with numerous layers of white-wash. Other elevations appear to have been untreated and show no decorative work.</p> <p>Windows appear to be spaced rather evenly in the walls. They are rather small in size with moderately wide untrimmed frames which hold two over two pane victorian period sashes. Shed roofed dormers, two bays in width, extend from each slope of the roof.</p> <p>The main entrance is located in the west bay of the front elevation. It is quite simple in appearance with framing similar to that of the windows. Another entrance in the north elevation is located at the lower level of the house.</p> <p>A double porch included under the main roof span extends along most of the front elevation.</p> <p>The roof is covered with asphalt shingles and terminates with a plain barge board set directly against the end walls. The only chimney is a relatively modern exterior flue extending up the east gable wall.</p> <p>The house is in deteriorated condition having been damaged by flood waters in 1972. The lot on which the house stands measures 155' x 80'.</p>

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE			
<p>The area of significance of this house is its architecture. It also derives significance from its apparent association with early milling operations near the junction of Marsh Run and the Antietam Creek.</p> <p>The exterior appearance of the house suggests that it may have been built during the early nineteenth century, possibly as a secondary dwelling associated with the milling operations. This stone structure with its double porch and its situation directly over a spring, is representative of a number of Washington County's early vernacular houses. Just west of this house is a large stone dwelling, dated 1774 and built by John Funk (Wa-I-124). The house stands on a tract of land called "Locust Bottom", containing 1086 acres, patented by Henry Funk December 22, 1759.</p> <p>Land records and early maps suggest that mills were in operation near the junction of the Antietam Creek and Marsh Run during the eighteenth and nineteenth centuries. In 1838, Jonathan Hager purchased 101 $\frac{1}{4}$ acres of "Locust Bottom" from Jacob Middlekauff and Elizabeth Middlekauff. The property became known as "Mill Brook Mills". In 1905, the property was purchased by the Antietam Paper Company and a paper mill was erected and operated for approximately 30 years.</p>





