DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE	
<p>This house is located on the south side of Old Forge Road, about 1/2 mile east of Antietam at the east end of Fiddlersburg in Washington County, Md. It is situated on a gentle slope and faces north.</p> <p>The structure is a four-bay log and frame dwelling covered with aluminum siding. The two east bays are of log construction and were apparently the original structure. The two western bays are of frame construction and were probably a later addition. According to the owner, the log section displayed the date of 1792 carved in timber over the front door.</p> <p>The windows and doors are simple in appearance and are spaced at random in the front elevation. The windows contain two-over-two pane Victorian period sashes. Entrances are located in the two central bays. A two-bay shed roofed entrance porch is located at the front elevation.</p> <p>The roof is covered with sheet metal and extends beyond the end walls of the house. A small brick chimney rises from inside the west end wall. A second flue is located south of the roof ridge at the jointure of the log and frame sections.</p> <p>The house is in excellent condition and stands on a lot 50' X 150' feet.</p>

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The area of significance of this building is its architecture. Although altered, it does provide an example of Washington County's log building tradition. It was purchased in 1900 by Zachary T. Ridenour from the Loose family who owned a large farm nearby (WA-I-114).

Many log structures were built in Washington County from the earliest days of settlement to well into the 19th century. A number of these buildings continue in use today, disguised by various forms of siding or bricks.

These buildings are worthy of note as representatives of a major architectural group in Western Maryland and the Cumberland Valley.

The 1792 date said to be on the log portion of the structure is unusual, making this house one of the few dated examples of log construction in the County.




