This farm complex consisting of a one and a half story rough cast house, presumably of stone construction, barns and outbuildings appears to date from the early 19th century. The house with a double porch along its entire front elevation which has an eastern exposure is an example of a regional type prominent in the Cumberland Valley. It was presumably built by John McKee whose father emigrated from Ireland before 1787 when John is said to have been born.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This farm complex is located south of Reid Road, approximately one half mile east of Oaks Road in Washington County, Maryland. The house is situated on high ground and faces east.

The dwelling is a one and a half story, five bay structure presumably of stone construction sheathed with rough cast or stucco. The house is built into a hillside so that it is a full two stories in height at the front elevation while the rear or west wall is one story high. A double porch which is not included under the main roof span extends along the front elevation. Although the porch appears to be original, its supports have been replaced at the lower level with round metal poles. The upper part has square wooden chamfered posts with a plain balustrade. A decoratively cut trim board extends along the eaves of the porch. Access to the second level is gained by a flight of concrete steps at the south end of the porch. The north end is enclosed by a wall with a window at each story level.

Windows and doors in the house have moderately wide frames with pegged joining at the main story level. At the ground floor level, pegged joining was not observed. There openings had square rather than mitered corners. The windows have six over six pane double hung sashes. Those at the attic level have four over two pane sashes.

Entrances are to be found in the first and third bays from the south end of the main level of the front elevation. Doors are located in the second and fourth bays at the ground story.

The roof is sheathed with sheet metal and extends beyond the end walls of the house. Brick chimneys are located inside each gable end.

A concrete block outbuilding is located immediately south of the house and several barns and agricultural structures are located further to the south.

The buildings appear to be in good to excellent condition and stand on a tract containing 112.4 acres, part of the land grant, "Nicholas' Contrivance."

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STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This farm complex consisting of a one and a half story rough cast house, presumably of stone construction, barns and outbuildings appears to date from the early 19th century. The house with a double porch along its entire front elevation which has an eastern exposure is an example of a regional type prominent in the Cumberland Valley. It was presumably built by John McKee whose father emigrated from Ireland before 1787 when John is said to have been born.

According to the Washington County Land Records, John McKee acquired the land comprising this farm in several transactions during the early 19th century. In 1823 he purchased 86 3/4 acres of "Nicholas' Contrivance" and "All I Could Get" from Daniel Rench (GG/484). On December 31, 1828, John McKee bought an additional 53 7/8 acres and a four acre tract from the heirs of Robert McKee. This land was part of "Clelland's Contrivance" and "Mary's Garden" which presumably adjoined the first purchase. Robert McKee had bought it in 1801 from John Brumbaugh for £221. (KK/481, N/445).

John McKee's farm was inherited by his son, Robert in 1871 (Will Liber F/441). Robert and Eliza McKee sold the farm, then containing slightly more than 141 acres to Abraham Eshleman in 1876 (74/459). In 1895, Abraham Eshleman sold approximately 128 acres to David H. and Mary L. Martin for \$10,310.50. The farm has remained under Martin ownership until the present. (104/259, 122/619, 366/472).


